TIMELESSWONDERS

Shrouded in mystery, steeped in legend, Wiltshire has been a special place for a very long time and our World Heritage Site pays testament to the ages. The ancient Britons believed Stonehenge was special, and if you stand on Salisbury Plain at sunrise or sunset it's easy to understand why, even today, people from around the world make the pilgrimage here.

At Avebury, a massive outer bank and ditch surround the world's largest stone circle which, in turn, encloses two smaller stone circles and part of the village. On a misty morning here you can appreciate the appeal this sacred place held for our ancestors.

The wider landscape is home to numerous other ancient structures including West Kennet Long Barrow, one of Britain's largest Stone Age burial sites, and Silbury Hill, the largest man-made mound in Europe.

Salisbury Cathedral is a magnificent example of Early English Gothic architecture and offers one superlative after another. The awesome sight of its spire soaring a breathtaking 123 metres (404 feet) into the air never fails to impress and within the Cathedral's Chapter House you'll find an exhibition

showcasing the best preserved of only four original 1215 Magna Carta manuscripts. For an unforgettable experience, a Tower Tour leads you up narrow, winding staircases to the foot of the spire, 225 feet above ground where you can enjoy panoramic views.

Among Wiltshire's other iconic sights are its White Horses carved into the rolling chalk downs, eight of which can still be seen today.

So make 2017 the year you visit Wiltshire, and discover more about our Timeless Wonders with events such as ancient technology demonstrations at Stonehenge, an exhibition of sculpture by Ana Maria Pacheco at Salisbury Cathedral, and a Spooky Samhain trail at Avebury - go to visitwiltshire.co.uk/whats-on for details of these and many more.







AMESBURY

The home of Stonehenge, historic Amesbury is an interesting town sitting on the River Avon.

Recognized as the oldest continuous living settlement in the country, dating back

over 8000 years BC, before Stonehenge.

Offering accommodation, local shops, restaurants and inns - the town is a great stopping point for travellers and visitors to Stonehenge and south Wiltshire. With plenty of parking, including coach spaces in the town centre.

Discover a breath taking museum housing one of Britain's largest mesolithic collections and the amazing story of how life was before and around Stonehenge.

The 13th century George Hotel houses an Aviation Heritage Centre - showing the story of the first use of planes by the Military in the area. Also, the Antrobus Arms Hotel, famous for The Beatles, who stayed there whilst filming Help on Salisbury Plain. At Solstice Park you can see the mighty Ancestor sculpture, representing the earliest

settlers in Amesbury around 10,000 years ago. To the south of the town lies Archers Gate, named after the Amesbury Archer who was found nearby. A sculpture depicting the Archer stands in the arcade there and an incredible town mosaic can be seen, telling the story of Amesbury.

The town offers many interesting walks both in the Stonehenge Landscape and close to the River Avon. There is a 2 mile walk to Stonehenge from Amesbury across the historic landscape, which is both invigorating and interesting.

To the north is Woodhenge - a neolithic site, which is an equally interesting site to visit. Closer to the town is Lords Walk which gives you a unique view of the River Avon as well as a nature walk down the old Lime Tree way.

Guides to these walks and other information can be found in the Community & Visitor

Centre, in the town centre.

The 10th century church of St Mary and St Melor houses a 15th century clock that is believed to have been built for the Benedictine Abbey. Also, crusader crosses, royal floor tiles and see the story of Queen Eleanor of Provence, who was given a royal funeral in Amesbury in 1291.

Iford Manor sits in the idyllic Frome river valley. Home to the famous Edwardian garden architect Harold Peto from 1899-1933, the gardens represent his 'Tuscan dream'. The romantic, terraced Italianate gardens are cut into the hillside, and characterised by pools, streams, statuary and buildings including a quasi-mediaeval cloister.

'The First Town on the Thames'. An ancient Saxon town on the edge of the Cotswolds, with over 100 listed buildings, an important site from the time of Alfred the Great. From 979 to 1100 the town had its own mint and a few coins can be seen in the Cricklade museum. Cricklade, granted a charter in 1155, has a Manorial Court with High Bailiff, Town Crier and other historical

For people who enjoy nature the North Meadow is a Site of Special Scientific Interest and in April the rare Snakehead Fritillaries can be seen. Blakehill Farm (originally a Second World War airfield) is now a nature reserve managed by Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, and of course the famous Thames Path

The annual festivals in June and December and a range of facilities on the historic High Street offer interest and a welcome to visitors.
