### Our pedigree is second to none

Back in 18th century Calne, the Harris family invented the traditional English technique of curing bacon and ham. In time, this became known as the 'Wiltshire Cure' and is now recognised countrywide. Many other Wiltshire specialities have been handed down the generations, remaining as tasty as ever today. So look out for local delicacies such as Wiltshire Lardy Cake, Malmesbury Pudding and Wiltshire Loaf. (That last one's a cheese, by the way, not a type of bread!)

#### What's on the menu?

Start the day by tucking into a hearty Wiltshire breakfast. Bacon, of course. Home-made bread, perhaps. Locally sourced jams and preserves. And eggs collected fresh from the hens that morning.

### Time for a cuppa

Later on, if you've worked up an appetite again thanks to a busy day's sightseeing, why not take a break?

You'll find coffee shops for your favourite latte, cappuccino or espresso. Tea rooms for mouth-watering cakes and pastries. And dairies serving ice cream made on site using milk from the farm's own cows. Linger over elevenses. Treat yourself to afternoon tea. Or enjoy a scoop or two of your favourite flavour whilst taking in the view.

Wiltshire also has an abundance of characterful inns. Town pubs and country pubs. Pubs with gardens and pubs with ghosts. Walkers, cyclists, children dogs... all are widely welcomed.

## Plenty to whet your appetite








## To market, to market


