Salisbury 800

Salisbury has been welcoming visitors since 1227 and to commemorate the 800-year anniversary of its Royal Charter in 2027, the city will host a vibrant programme of cultural events, exhibitions, performances and experiences celebrating Salisbury's heritage, creativity and future. Check out the suggested itinerary below and What's On Salisbury 800.

DAY 1

AM: Start your day with a tour of **Salisbury Cathedral**, a breathtaking example of Early English Gothic architecture. The Chapter House contains the finest of four original 1215 Magna Carta manuscripts and specialist tours are available to pre-book.

Stop for lunch at **Fisherton Mill** with its gallery, cafe and artist studios.

PM: Head into the city centre with its range of unique, independent shops. On Tuesday and Saturdays, the Charter Market will be in full swing (except the third Tuesday in October).

For evening entertainment – check out **Wiltshire Creative** and what's on at **Salisbury Playhouse**.

DAY 2

AM: Head back to The Cathedral Close to explore **Salisbury Museum**, where you can discover world-class collections spanning half a million years. Galleries include the Wessex Gallery of Archaeology, with the Amesbury Archer – a significant early Bronze Age burial; Constable and the Fine Art Collection with Constable's 'View of Salisbury from Harnham' and over 4,000 pieces of English pottery and porcelain in the Potted History of Britain.

Stop for lunch at **The Salisbury Museum's Café** or **Salisbury Cathedral's Refectory**.

PM: Step into history at **Mompesson House**, with its new exhibition room offering visitors a fresh way to experience this elegant Queen Anne townhouse in Salisbury's Cathedral Close. Be sure to stop for a quintessential English cup of tea in their tearoom.

For evening entertainment – check out what's on at **City Hall**.

DAY 3

AM: Discover the fascinating history at **The Rifles Berkshire and Wiltshire Museum**. Recently re-opened after major redevelopment, the museum features three permanent galleries, a temporary exhibition space and shop. New themed displays 'ordinary people, extraordinary courage,' tells stories of soldiers from the regiments of Berkshire and Wiltshire from the 18th century to the present day.

If time allows head next door to **Arundells** - private home of former Prime Minister Sir Edward Heath.

Stop for lunch at **The Rifles Café** or **Salisbury Cathedral's Refectory**.

PM: Stake a tour with **Heritage & Stone Tours** to visit the **World Heritage Site of Stonehenge**.

Stone Circle Experiences or Explorer Tours available to pre-book.

Salisbury Hotels: There is plenty of choice of trade accommodation in and around Salisbury. In the city centre you'll find **Legacy Rose & Crown**, **Milford Hall Hotel**, and **Mercure White Hart Hotel**. In the surrounding areas are **Stonehenge Hostel**, **Holiday Inn Salisbury Stonehenge**, and **The Stones Hotel**.
