- Less well known, yet equally impressive, Avebury is Wiltshire's 'other' stone circle. Part of the same World Heritage Site as Stonehenge, Avebury is the largest stone circle in the world
- Wiltshire is rural England at its very best. Among our many timeless villages, the stars of the show are the honey-coloured gems of Lacock and Castle Combe, the perfect places to journey back in time.

GREAT WEST WAY - 3 days

72 hours on the Great West Way will bring the England of your imagination to life. Stately homes and gardens, cosy coaching inns, heritage cities and country villages – all set in a picture-perfect green and pleasant land.

The Great West Way passes by Heathrow Airport and is easy to join from the UK's ferry ports.

DAY 1

Morning: Join the Great West Way at Royal Windsor. Windsor Castle is the largest and oldest occupied castle in the world – where Her Majesty The Queen spends most of her private weekends. The essential experience here is the spectacular Changing of the Guard.

Lunch: A traditional pub in Royal Windsor.

Afternoon: Follow the River Thames to Henley, one of the most beautiful towns in England. Find a pub where Charles 1 drank, a chantry house, and a butcher who smokes his own meat. Then visit majestic Cliveden Gardens, set high above the River Thames with farreaching views over the Berkshire countryside.

Overnight: A cosy coaching inn in a quintessentially

Overnight: A cosy coaching inn in a quintessentially English village on the outskirts of Newbury.

DAY 2

Morning: Sample the pace of an English market town at Hungerford, on the banks of the Kennet & Avon Canal. The canal towpath is a great walking route through the town and out into the surrounding countryside. At Hungerford Wharf, take a boat trip on the canal.

Lunch: In the historic towns of Corsham or Calne. Afternoon: Explore Lacock Abbey, a country house with monastic roots founded in the 13th century. William Henry Fox Talbot invented the world's first photographic negative here in 1835. The Fox Talbot Museum tells his story. For an authentic taste of English village life, travel on to Castle Combe in the Cotswolds which features regularly as a film location, most recently in *The Wolfman, Stardust* and Steven Spielberg's *War Horse*. Overnight: Treat yourself to a night at a Cotswolds country house hotel.

DAY 3

Morning: Explore Bradford on Avon, perfectly situated on the edge of the Cotswolds. St Laurence's Church has been welcoming travellers since at least the 1120s and the 14th century Tithe Barn is one of the country's finest examples of a medieval 'cathedral of the land'. **Lunch:** At a cosy café on the Kennet & Avon Canal.

Afternoon: Travel, via Farleigh Hungerford Castle, to Bath. Start your visit at Bath Abbey, before moving on to the Roman Baths. Constructed around 70 AD as a grand bathing and socialising complex, they are now some of the best preserved Roman remains in the world. Take afternoon tea at the Jane Austen Centre, choosing a table on the rooftop terrace for splendid views of this Georgian World Heritage Site, or visit the American Museum in Britain, just outside the city.

Then either return to London or travel on to Bristol, one of England's most vibrant and creative cities.

BRITAIN'S ARMED FORCES AND THE STORY OF FLIGHT – 2 days

REME Museum • Museum of Army Flying • The Rifles Berkshire and Wiltshire Museum • Boscombe Down Aviation Collection • Royal Signals Museum • Fleet Air Arm Museum

DAY 1

Morning: Your itinerary begins at REME Museum which opened at a new site in Lyneham during 2017. Preserving the heritage of the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, its collection houses over 100,000 items. Then head south across Salisbury Plain, the largest army training area in the UK.

Lunch: Salisbury or Middle Wallop.

Afternoon: Telling the story of British soldiers in the air, the Museum of Army Flying sits beside the busy Army Air Corps Airfield at Middle Wallop, near Salisbury. Exhibits include over 35 fixed wing and rotary aircraft, while displays range from the pioneering era of balloons and kites through to modern-day helicopter operations. Overnight: Salisbury area.

DAY 2

Morning: Start your day at The Rifles Berkshire and Wiltshire Museum, in Salisbury's Cathedral Close, which showcases the exploits of the infantry of these two

regiments from 1743 until the present day. Then pay a visit to Boscombe Down Aviation Collection on the northern outskirts of the city, where over 100 exhibits, including 30 aircraft, bring the history of test flight in the UK to life.

Lunch: Salisbury area.

Afternoon: Either head for the Royal Signals Museum near Blandford Forum, which traces the history of the British Army's battlefield communications from the introduction of the telegraph in the Crimea, via espionage and satellites, to today's digital battlefields of cyberspace and electronic warfare. Or travel west to Fleet Air Arm Museum, near Yeovil, which tells the story of the Royal Navy in the air and houses the largest collection of aircraft in Europe, including a replica of the aircraft carrier HMS Ark Royal. Or, if you have an extra half day to spare, you could always extend your stay for another night and include both.





WILTSHIRE'S WORLD HERITAGE SITE – 2 days

Stonehenge • Amesbury History Centre • The Salisbury Museum • Avebury • West Kennet Long Barrow • Silbury Hill • Wiltshire Museum

DAY 1

Morning: Where better to begin your tour than at iconic Stonehenge which, along with Avebury and other associated monuments, forms part of Wiltshire's World Heritage Site. Outstanding exhibitions in the Stonehenge visitor centre set the monument in its historic context and pre-bookable tours are available with one of our local guides (see page 10). If you have time, pop into Amesbury History Centre to view their collection of Mesolithic artefacts.

Lunch: Amesbury or Salisbury areas – The Stonehenge

Inn & Carvery is one of the closest to Stonehenge.

Afternoon: Discover more about the World Heritage
Site's story at The Salisbury Museum which houses
one of Europe's most extensive collections of finds
from Stonehenge, as well as the Monkton Deverill Gold
Torc and the grave of the Amesbury Archer, the richest
Beaker burial in Britain.

Overnight: Salisbury or Amesbury areas – The Cathedral Hotel in Salisbury is one option.

DAY 2

Morning: As you travel north across Wiltshire, keep an eye out for our famous White Horses, carved into the rolling chalk hillsides. First stop today is at Avebury, the largest stone circle in the world. As well as the stones themselves, take a stroll around the village and be sure to visit the Alexander Keiller Museum and Avebury Manor. Avebury lies at the centre of a prehistoric complex in the North Wessex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Nearby you will find West Kennet Long Barrow, one of Britain's largest Stone Age burial sites, and mysterious Silbury Hill, the largest man-made mound in Europe.

Lunch: Calne or Devizes areas.

Afternoon: Spend a fascinating afternoon at Wiltshire Museum in Devizes, where you will find galleries spanning Neolithic, Bronze Age, Iron Age, Roman, Saxon and Medieval times, including Gold from the Time of Stonehenge.

DAY 1

Morning: First stop on your itinerary this morning is historic Lydiard Park, where you will find plenty to explore, from the elegant staterooms of the Palladian house, to the 18th century walled garden and extensive formal parkland.

Lunch: Swindon area.

Afternoon: Be transported to the tropics as you enjoy a magical walk through hundreds of the world's most beautiful butterflies at Studley Grange Butterfly World and Craft Village. Then make the acquaintance of otters, goats, meerkats and more in the outdoor Animal Paddock, before picking up a unique souvenir of your trip at the craft village. If you have time, stop off at The Museum of Computing to learn all about the development of digital technology, or (from July to September) lose yourself in Braydon Maize Maze.

Overnight: Swindon Area - Alexandra House in Wroughton is one option.

DAY 2

Morning: First up today is a visit to STEAM – Museum of the Great Western Railway, housed in the Grade II listed buildings of Brunel's former railway works.

Lunch: Swindon area.

Afternoon: Take the opportunity to grab a bargain at McArthurGlen Designer Outlet which shares the same site as STEAM and is home to over 100 stores selling a range of high street and designer labels at discounts of up to 60%. Or continue the steam train theme with a trip on the nearby Swindon & Cricklade Railway.

Evening: With a varied programme including concerts, comedy, dance, drama and musical theatre, a performance at Swindon's Wyvern Theatre makes a great way to round off your visit.

DAY 1

Afternoon: Choose between the breathtaking pastoral landscape at Bowood House and Gardens where master landscaper 'Capability' Brown created a flowing mix of woodlands and lawns sloping down to a lake. Or the charming Arts & Crafts garden at Great Chalfield Manor near Melksham, now in the care of the National Trust. **Overnight:** Bradford on Avon area.

DAY 2

Morning: Today begins with a visit to the delightful Peto Garden at Iford Manor, an Edwardian version of Tuscany with romantic, Italianate gardens cut into the hillside. **Lunch:** Bradford on Avon or Trowbridge areas.

Afternoon: Choose between Longleat, where the outstanding Elizabethan house is surrounded by 900 acres of stunning 'Capability' Brown landscape. Or the famous 18th century gardens at Stourhead with their lake and classical temples. For much of the year the Palladian House here is also open.


Overnight: Warminster or Salisbury areas - the Holiday Inn Salisbury-Stonehenge is one option.

DAY 3

Morning: Explore the 22 acres of parkland and gardens at Wilton House, beside the rivers Nadder and Wylye. **Lunch:** Wilton or Salisbury areas.

Afternoon: Travel across Cranborne Chase and West Wiltshire Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty to visit the extraordinary Victorian gardens at Larmer Tree, recognised as a Garden of National Importance.

If you have more time, the following are just across the county borders: Chavenage House, Kelmscott Manor and Westonbirt The National Arboretum in the Cotswolds, and Sir Harold Hillier Gardens in Hampshire.

DAY 1

Morning: Spend the morning in Trowbridge where the woollen cloth industry dates back 1000 years, leaving a rich architectural legacy. Trowbridge Museum (closing June 2018 for refurbishment) has a nationally important collection relating to West Country wool.

Lunch: Trowbridge or Bradford on Avon areas - the Bridge Tea Rooms is one option.

Afternoon: At the peak of its textile production Bradford on Avon was home to more than 30 cloth factories. Today the impressive walls of Abbey Mill still flank the river, while former weavers' cottages cling to the hillside.

Overnight: Bradford on Avon or Melksham areas.

DAY 2

Morning: Pause your journey to call in at honey-coloured Corsham, which owed its former prosperity to the wool trade. Then move on to Malmesbury to uncover the history of fine lace making at the Athelstan Museum.

Lunch: Malmesbury or Swindon areas.

Afternoon: Travel on to Swindon and take a step back in time at STEAM – Museum of the Great Western Railway, housed in the Grade II listed buildings of Isambard Kingdom Brunel's former railway works.

Overnight: Swindon or Devizes areas.

DAY 3

Morning: Wiltshire has long been renowned for its local ales. Discover the history and heritage of brewing on a tour of Wadworth Brewery in Devizes, then maybe follow this with a narrowboat trip on the Kennet & Avon Canal. **Lunch:** Devizes or Marlborough areas.

Afternoon: Head to Crofton Beam Engines near Marlborough to discover magnificent 200-year-old working steam engines still capable of performing their original task. On Sundays and Bank Holiday Mondays you can also visit Wilton Windmill nearby.

Lunch: Salisbury Area - Britford Farm Shop and Cafe is one option.

An action-packed intergalactic battlefield movie filmed in part at the 'real' Stonehenge as well as a highly convincing replica nearby.

THE WHITE PRINCESS (2017)

This 8-part TV series, adapted from a historical novel of the same name by Philippa Gregory, was filmed in Bradford on Avon.

POLDARK (2015 AND 2016)

The charming Wiltshire market town of Corsham was selected as the perfect match for 18th century Truro in the first series, while Great Chalfield Manor and Gardens featured in series two

DOWNTON ABBEY (2015)

Filming for the sixth and final series of this hit TV series took place in the village of Lacock.

WOLF HALL (2015)

River scenes from this film featuring Juliette Binoche and Johnny Depp were filmed at Fonthill Lake, near the charming village of Fonthill Bishop.

SENSE AND SENSIBILITY (1995)

The National Trust's Mompesson House featured as the London home of Mrs Jennings, while the Double Cube Room at Wilton House was used for ballroom scenes.

FAR FROM THE MADDING CROWD (1967)

The town of Devizes featured as Casterbridge in this major hit starring Julie Christie, Peter Finch, Alan Bates and Terence Stamp.

Other big screen films featuring Wiltshire locations include The Other Boleyn Girl (2008) and Saving Private Ryan (1998). 




