Meeting Notes:

1. Welcome, introductions and actions from last meeting

2. Review of activity / 2018 goals or objectives / how's business

For most businesses 2017 was a successful year showing similar or increased group visitors numbers / revenue when compared to 2016. Forward group bookings are also looking promising for 2018. Norman Allen Group Travel communicated that their UK sales are growing.

David communicated the national picture in respect to inbound and domestic visitors. VisitBritain are reporting a record year for inbound tourism in 2017 and growth is expected to continue into 2018. Further info can be found <u>here</u>. Domestic visitors are flat overall but with Wiltshire outperforming the national trend.

3. Wiltshire's Trade Marketing Activity Update and 2018 plan

a. New printed publications

Flo spoke about and passed around VisitWiltshire's new Visitor Guide, Visitor Map and Travel Trade Guide.

b. Exhibitions – Excursions (27 Jan), BIM (30 Jan) and SW Group Travel Show (3 Feb).

The group discussed these forthcoming exhibitions and Flo reiterated the importance of group partners supplying relevant literature to her before the deadline dates for these events.

BTTS was raised as an event that had been good in the past. This year's event will be at NEC Birmingham on 21 & 22 March and it was decided that as a number of people were attending this as visitors – someone would be able to report back at the next meeting.

There was no interest in attending the GO travel Show being run by GTO Mag at Kempton Park on 17 April. However, Claire from Norman Allen said that they would be going as a visitor and would report back for future reference.

c. Familiarisation Visits – forthcoming; Great West Way (25 – 28 Feb), VisitWiltshire (18 – 20 March), AGTO (15 June).

Fam visits were discussed and Flo agreed to share the draft VisitWiltshire fam visit 18 – 20 March to relevant group members as this was starting to be promoted – already with interest from two people from an USA tour operator. This has subsequently been issued and is being pulled together.

d. Showcase South West event

Many businesses commented positively about the recent Showcase South West event in Bristol, seeing return business starting to come through.
