TIMELESS WONDERS

One outstanding World Heritage Site, embracing two iconic stone circles. Shrouded in mystery, steeped in legend, they stand testament to the ages. No visit to Wiltshire would be complete without experiencing the magic of **Stonehenge** and **Avebury.**

The ancient Britons attached great significance to Stonehenge. Among its many unique features is its orientation on the rising and setting sun. Why it was built in this way nobody knows for sure, but if you stand on Salisbury Plain at sunrise or sunset it's easy to understand why, even today, people from around the globe make the pilgrimage here.

On a misty morning at Avebury you can appreciate the appeal this sacred place held for our ancestors. Here, a massive outer bank and ditch surround the world's largest stone circle. This, in turn, encloses two smaller stone circles and part of the village. The wider landscape is home to other ancient structures too, including **West Kennet Long Barrow,** one of Britain's largest Stone Age burial sites; the man-made mound of **Silbury Hill,** its origins lost in the mists of time; and many of Wiltshire's distinctive **White Horses** carved into the rolling chalk downs, eight of which can still be seen today.

Offering one superlative after another, **Salisbury Cathedral** is a magnificent example of Early English Gothic architecture. The awesome sight of its spire soaring a breathtaking 123 metres (404 feet) into the sky never fails to impress,

and within the Cathedral's Chapter House you'll find an exhibition showcasing the finest of only four surviving original 1215 Magna Carta. For an unforgettable experience, a Tower Tour leads you up narrow, winding staircases to the foot of the spire, 225 feet above ground where you can enjoy panoramic views across Salisbury.

Wiltshire has been a special place for a very long time. The World Heritage Site of Stonehenge and Avebury has a magnetism that has drawn people to it for thousands of years. Make 2018 the year you visit and experience this ancient county for yourself.





CRICKLADE

'The First Town on the Thames'. An ancient Saxon town on the edge of the Cotswolds, with over 100 listed buildings, an important site from the time of Alfred the Great. From 979 to 1100 the town had its own mint and a few coins can be seen in the Cricklade Museum. Cricklade, granted a charter in 1155, has a Manorial Court with a High Bailiff, a Town Crier and other historical posts.

For people who enjoy nature, North Meadow is a Site of Special Scientific Interest, and in April the rare Snakehead Fritillaries can be seen. Blakehill Farm (originally a Second World War airfield) is now a nature reserve managed by Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, and of course the famous Thames Path meanders through the town.

The annual festivals are held in June and December and a range of facilities on the historic High Street offer interest and a welcome to visitors.




GREAT CHALFIELD MANOR AND GARDEN

Annual events include a literature festival, summer school, art trails, mop fairs, remembrance parade, music events, Christmas lights and more.






WILTSHIRE WILDLIFE TRUST NATURE RESERVES

Wiltshire Wildlife Trust has 37 nature reserves across the county. From the chalky grasslands in the south to Braydon Forest in the north, Wiltshire is home to some rare and beautiful flora and fauna.

Highlights include:

Lower Moor Farm, near Cricklade, is renowned for its wildflower meadows. Blackmoor Copse, near Salisbury, is one of the most important woods in Wiltshire for butterflies. Langford Lakes, near Wilton, is a rare open body of water in the south of the county and a perfect spot for those that enjoy bird watching. Because of its great age, Clouts Wood near Wroughton is home to some wonderful and rare woodland flowers.
