# LACOCK



This beautiful National Trust village is one of Wiltshire's real gems. With houses dating from the 13th century, a majestic abbey and winding streets to explore, you will certainly want to set aside some extra time to explore. The abbey became the home of William Fox Talbot, pioneer of photography, and a museum commemorating his work is situated outside the abbey gates. (N.B. Being in a river valley, parts of the route may occasionally be flooded)

## The walk



Turn R from the car park and R again on the road leading out of the village, in front of Lacock Abbey. Cross the river by the raised path. Continue past the waymarked path on your L and take the next stile on your L, just before the chapel.

## 2 0.8km/½ mile

Follow the upper hedge until reaching a walkway over the stream with a stile. Cross the stile and walk up the L edge of the field through and at the next curve to a gateway in the L hand corner. leave the riverbank and cut half Cross the next field, bearing L to a left across the field to finish at the gateway in the Lhand corner of the L-hand of a raised, fenced far hedge. Cross another field to meet a bend in the River Avon, with a waymarked stile. Take care as this stile has a steep drop and the ground can be boggy.

## **3** 1.6km/1 mile

Go over the stile and follow the riverbank to a kissing gate in the fence by the willow trees. Go

footpath. A signpost is visible where the path joins the river bridge at Reybridge.

### 4 2.3km/1½ miles

Cross the river and turn L at the Tiunction, following the road for a few yards. Turn L onto a paved path between cottages where the road bends. Follow the path

across a field. Looking back across vour route vou can view Bowden Hill to the R and Naish Hill to the L. Turn L at the kissing gate at the end of this path.

### 5 2.8km/1¾ miles

Continue along the lane across a picturesque 18th century packhorse bridge by a ford (one of the oldest ways into Lacock and a good place to wash your boots!).

### 6 3.1km/2 miles

At the end of the lane, turn R. leaving St Cyriac church to your L. Pass King John's Hunting Lodge and take the first road L (East Street). Pass the 18th century lockup and entrance to the Tithe Barn. On meeting the village's

main street at the Red Lion, turn L past the Fox Talbot Museum of Photography and take a gravelled path by the road and through trees to the car park.
